Summary	Jennings offers a discussion on fresh water and marine tourism focused on boating, sporting, adventure, and sustainability, offering a market profile on surfing, noting that the sport of surfing pays great attention to public concerns over water quality. Jennings discusses the example of <i>Surfers Against Sewage</i> (SAS), a not-for-profit organization founded by surfers who campaign for clean and safe recreational waters. The study identifies that the organization’s use of media-catching images and proactive arguments based upon published research has brought validity and success to the advocacy for clean water at surfing beaches.			

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
