2020 Course Syllabus

Description

This course is designed for students to understand the development of civilization in Southeast Asia, including important factors leading to prosperities and disparities in and among major empires of the region. This course reveals the impact of external influences, including colonial powers leading to political, religious, social and economic changes in Southeast Asia. The concept of regionalism and the formation of ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations) is discussed in the contexts of development, communication and cooperation.

Objectives

- 1. To know and understand the fundamental concepts of civilization with emphasis in the Southeast Asian context.
- 2. To distinguish the prehistory and history of major cultural periods and empires in Southeast Asia, such as Champa, Khmer, Pagan, Srivijaya, Sukhothai and Ayutthaya.
- 3. To identify significant interactions and adaptations in Southeast Asian societies.
- 4. To analyze the impacts of social, political and economic development and change in Southeast Asia from c. 1400-2020.
- 5. To consider the forces behind the formation of ASEAN and current events in the region.
