PHILOSOPHY—FAITH—RELIGION

Philosophy

- + something we follow
 - × A sphere of thought)
 - The pursuit of wisdom

× Faith

- + fidelity (loyalty/devotion)
- + Sincerity of intention
- + A type of religious behavior?

Religion

- + belief in doctrine
- + The worship of, or commitment and devotion to a god or gods


ETHICS (n.)

- **MORALITY** (n.)
- The theory or principles of human conduct.
- The rightness and wrongness of actions.
- The goodness and badness of intention.



- Conformity to ideals of right human conduct.
- Human conscience or ethical judgment.





CHINESE FAITH & RELIGION

- Chinese Religious Experience vs. Chinese Faith
 - + It may be hard to make a clear distinction...



- Religion may be a formal doctrine and organization
 - + External: The temple/ceremony/priest/etc.
- * Faith is more internal, more personal
 - + Faith in Heaven
 - + No doctrine, yet there is belief

CHINESE 'FAITH' and MORALITY

- Faith in the <u>history</u> vindicated through historical record (e.g., legends/scriptures/books)
 - + A strong sense of faith in history (and civilization?)
 - + History will judge your behavior
- A type of religious behavior
- Unseen assumption/divine
- History of family/society/nation

Veneration of one's ancestor

CHINESE 'FAITH' and MORALITY

- Faith in 'Heaven'
 - + 'more to life than meets the eye'
- × No Doctrine, but you believe




- Mortality of human being ancestor pass away but there is continuity of history after death
- Strong faith and continuity of ancestor worship
 - × The house alter is an external manifestation of religious faith
 - × Protection from evil spirit

TAOISM as **PANTHEISM**?

"All is God"

- Connecting God with the forces and laws of the universe.
 - The belief that all nature is God.
- The belief that everything is God.
 - I am God, you are God, the universe is God.
 - There is no 'supreme' being.



VENERATION OF 'GODLINESS'


- Natural hero

CONTINUITY OF HISTORY AFTER DEATH

- Chinese family history, family record, follows the male lineage
- Treasures the continuity of family member
- Chinese faith is the typical humanism
- Human is human after death
- The significant question of "Who am I"
 - + I am who I am even if I die.
- Chinese give the dead 'Intellectual apprehension'
 - + Cognition of 'heritage'



MAZU - THE STORY OF LIN MO NIANG

- She went into a trance during a storm and used her spiritual powers to save three of her four brothers from being lost at sea
- She was roused from her trance before she could save the fourth brother.
- She died soon afterwards.

 - Mountains


